


NORTH MACEDONIA: LESSONS LEARNED FOR SYRIA

Hello, I would also like to thank ECKS for moving the experience from theory to practice because I think the main point we learned from this visit is: Historians and political researchers often give a different picture of reality, but if we visit the regions physically ourselves, we will discover more real things.

The first point to note in this visit is that the subject is often not true, meaning when we got to know the experience, it was considered as a message saying: It is centralization, but we want to call it decentralization because practically everything in it is central, and we did not see the proposed decentralization, It was also noticed that there is a strong centralization in all departments concerned with the affairs of government and the state,



while this centralization turns into a semi-separation when it comes to external financing, the center does not interfere in that when there is international financing.

It is also clear that the main outcome of the political process after 2001 and the agreement and amending the constitution is the recognition of the components and giving them cultural rights, and then working to consolidate the rift between them.
